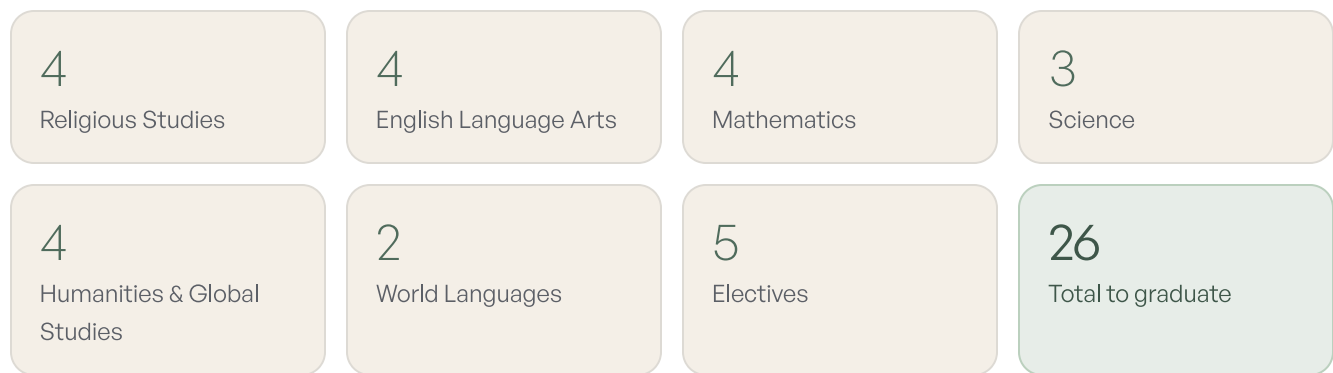


What Your Student Needs to *Graduate*

Every GPA diploma is built on **26 credits** earned across seven areas of study. The plan below is not a checklist to survive — it is a path we walk with you, designed so your student graduates formed as well as prepared: rooted in Scripture, fluent in the great conversation of history and literature, and ready for whatever comes next.

Use this guide to see the whole four years at once. Your student's Advisor will help you turn it into a year-by-year schedule.



What is a credit? One credit is a full year of study in a subject — a two-semester course. A half credit (0.5) is a single semester. Most students carry six to seven credits a year, which keeps all 26 comfortably within four years.

Both tracks meet the requirement equally. Students planning to study or serve abroad often prefer Track 1; those aiming at U.S. civic life or government often choose Track 2.
